Opportunities for Giving

First Day School: Donations to Heifer International

The First Day School children will have Christmas ornaments to share on December 17, and will gratefully accept contributions towards Heifer International, an organization that makes gifts of animals and training to families in need around the world. Recipients pass on the gifts, both animals and training. It is the gift that keeps on giving, spreading hope and opportunity throughout the world. Last year the children were very excited to collect enough money to send a buffalo to a family in need.

Social Justice Committee: Gifts for the Friendship Center and Stamps for OAR

Social Justice Committee will coordinate holiday gift giving to the Friendship Center of the American Red Cross again this year. The folks who use the Friendship Center who are often homeless (this is where they can stay during the day and where assistance is provided for applying for Medicaid, doing job applications, etc. is done) and are appreciative of what we can provide. The Case Manager of the Friendship Center has asked that we provide gift certificates and will be given the gender and ages of 30 people. Barbara Barry will bring the list on

December 3 and we hope that Meeting will respond generously as they have in the past to fill the list.

SJC will also be collecting cards and stamps for OAR. These will be given to inmates in the Tompkins County Jail. The cards do not have to be Christmas cards as clients often like to send cards to friends and family at other times.

January 19 – 21: TRAVEL UNDER CONCERN: DRAWING OUT GIFTS V

Travel under concern can be a vital source of spiritual nourishment for both the concerned Friend and those to whom the concern is brought. Now more than ever, we have need of faithful travelers who can help us be open and faithful to the Spirit's guidance. Some of us are very experienced in this kind of work, others are not, but everyone has more to learn, from our own experience and from each other. During this weekend, we will explore several aspects of travel under concern.

This will be a real workshop, in which the experience and present concerns of attenders will be an important source of material. Topics are likely to include: understanding a concern, finding the right "form" in following the concern; discernment and decision-making while carrying the concern; relating your concern to others'; travelers and their relationship to their home meeting; the relation of faithfulness under concern to the Lamb's War.

This workshop is especially for any who are feeling led to travel under concern, whatever the concern may be. Friends who feel drawn to travel in Gospel ministry are particularly encouraged to attend.

January 26 – 28: NONTHEISM AMONG FRIENDS Robin Alpern and Joan Lukas

As early as 1976, the Friends General Conference Gathering hosted a well-attended Workshop for Nontheistic Friends. In the decades since, Friends have become increasingly aware of the theological diversity of our Religious Society. Through experience and statistical studies, we have learned a large proportion of our members and attenders are somewhere on a spectrum that includes post-christians, agnostics, atheists, secularists, humanists. How can we be nontheists and Quakers too? If our Quaker life is not centered on belief in God, what is our center? What are our challenges? How can theists and nontheists enrich each other while holding views that differ?

We will explore the faith and practice of Quaker nontheists and the richness of a spiritual life not necessarily dependent on belief in God. While sharing our theologies, we will remain grounded in what we "know experimentally". To expand our base of knowledge, we will consider the findings of a recent survey of nontheistic Quakers. We invite all seekers – to celebrate and deepen our own beliefs and practices, and our appreciation for the beliefs and practices of others, so that we may all enjoy what Henry Cadbury called "the natural variety in Quakerism."

Robin Alpern, a member of Scarsdale Meeting, is one of the originators and many-times co-leader of the Nontheism Among Friends workshop, offered at the FGC Gathering since 1996. Joan Lukas, a member of Cambridge Meeting (NEYM), has facilitated the workshop several times. Robin and Joan each contributed an essay to Godless for God's Sake: Nontheism in Contemporary Quakerism, David Boulton, ed., available from www.quakerbooks.org.
